Employment Assistance Program: Assists participants in obtaining the skills needed to gain employment or a better paying job.

Commodity Food Distribution: Eligible participants receive a food box containing government surplus food funded by the Emergency Food Assistance Program every quarter.

Holiday Food Box: Eligible applicants receive a food box in the month of November with the adequate items to make a Thanksgiving Dinner. Applications for the Holiday Food Box are normally accepted in October each year.

Head Start: Head Start provides a comprehensive child development program for children. See Childcare Assistance on p.5 for more information.

Homelessness Prevention: The Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing programs provide financial assistance and services to prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless and help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized

REALL: Youth poverty simulation designed for youth in grades 7th-12th grades that allows students to see the difference in reactive and proactive lives.

Student Market: Students in K-12th grade are eligible for receiving assistance once a month only during extended school closures. Offers additional items such as hygiene and household products, underwear, socks, shoes, diapers, and feminine products when available.

Utility Assistance: The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) assists eligible persons with their utility bills. **Assurance 16** provides energy efficiency and financial literacy education to participants in the HEAP program, participation is limited. Eligible participants may be eligible to receive a fan from our **Fan Program**.

FIRST CONSIDERATION – PLEASE READ

- Residents who have already established a good patient-dentist relationship should explain their financial limitations to their dentist and request the most cost-effective treatment plan estimate before changing dentists.
- There is often more than one treatment plan that will achieve the goal of oral health. It is generally better to stick with a dentist one trusts and who knows the patient's needs as well as their medical and dental history.
- The practice's financial manager may be able to work out an acceptable payment schedule according to the patient's ability to pay for services.

VA case managers are available daily to help connect veterans with both VA and community resources to help meet their needs. If not already enrolled, a veteran must first be entered into the VA system before accessing VA programs and services.  - Workforce Services are available to assist with employment, educations, and vocational needs.
 - The VA's Shuttle Service provides transportation to and from our Little Rock and North Little Rock hospital campuses.
 - The Day Treatment Center building houses staff from the HCHV programs.
- HCHV Residential Treatment and Case Management
 - Veterans who seek relief from homelessness are placed at one of our four contracted facilities. Sober Living, St. Francis House, and BCD-Empowerment Center are in Little Rock, Arkansas.
 - Individuals must have thirty days documented sobriety or no history of SUD in order to receive placement at St. Francis House. Veterans who require intensive SUD treatment are placed at Wilbur D. Mills (Searcy, Arkansas).
 - While in residential treatment, Veterans receive weekly case management and are linked to VA and community programs and services to assist them in meeting their needs and helping them to escape homelessness.
 - Veterans agree to maintain complete sobriety while in residential treatment, and many are participating in HCHV SUD outpatient treatment and/or SUD groups at Fort Roots VA.
- Supported Housing
 - Designed to assist Veterans with obtaining affordable housing in the community, through either private property owners or government housing programs.
 - Veterans seeking assistance through this program must agree to participate in identified aftercare programs and receive on-going case management follow-up from the program coordinator for a specified period.

- HUD-VASH
 - Joint venture between Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and VA. This program began in 1992.
 - Veterans who participate in the program receive a housing voucher that subsidizes their rent.
 - Veterans interested in the program must also agree to aftercare involvement, as well as close follow-up from the program.
 - Individuals must meet the low-income threshold and must not have a record as a sex offender.
 - Unlike traditional Section 8 Housing Vouchers, individuals with a felony background may utilize HUD-VASH vouchers.
- Health Care for Re-Entry Veterans (HVRC)
 - This program focuses on incarcerated Veterans in Arkansas state and federal prison Systems.
 - Its intent is to provide these Veterans with linkages to VA and community resources to help them make a smooth transition back into mainstream society and to prevent street homelessness.
- Veterans Justice Outreach (VJO)
 - This program is designed to assist Veterans incarcerated in local jails with transitioning into the community and gaining access to VA services to address their clinical needs and work toward improving their stability.
