Confirm your setting with the TCA. Bench trials or hearings lasting more than 4 hours may require a special setting, available upon request.

2021 Division One Jury Trial Information

Jury trial settings:

Civil cases from any county in the 16th Judicial District may be set during listed jury weeks. After consulting with opposing counsel complete and submit the Docket Setting Sheet. When setting a case, select a week not a day certain. Trials which require more than a one-week should be scheduled during extended jury terms. Scheduling orders will be issued in most cases or upon request.

Multiple cases will be set during each jury term. Cases will be prioritized by the Court as to first out, second out, etc. based on the following: first to request, age of case, subject matter, and length of trial. Parties will be given confirmation of the case prioritization at the final pre-trial hearing before the jury trial.

Unless otherwise notified by the court, cases on the docket must be prepared for trial on the first day of the jury week regardless of case prioritization. If a case with a higher priority setting does not proceed to trial as scheduled, counsel for the next case in line is expected to present their case to the jury.
