CLEBURNE COUNTY QUORUM COURT JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

September 10, 2020

The Cleburne County Quorum Court met in regular session in the County Court Building, 922 South 9th Street, Heber Springs, Arkansas. The meeting was called to order at 6:03 p.m. County Judge Jerry Holmes presided. PRESENT: Pearson, Henegar, Caldwell, Blackburn, Malone, Evans, Jay Cupit, Foust, Roberts, Owens. ABSENT: None.

READING, CORRECTION, AND DISPOSITION OF MINUTES:

Motion was made by JP Caldwell to approve the minutes of the August 13, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by JP Roberts. Voice vote, motion carried.

REPORT OF TREASURER:

Motion was made by JP Malone to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by JP Caldwell. Voice vote, motion carried.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

JP Evans reported the Jail Committee has not met again. The Committee is still waiting on information from the firm regarding the renovation of the jail. Sheriff Brown reported that Jail population has been growing a little.

Proposed Ordinance No. 2020-Establishing Number of Members of Budget Committee

JP Malone withdrew Proposed Ordinance.

NEW BUSINESS:

Proposed Resolution No. 2020-Declaring a Vacancy in JP District 9

JP Evans introduced a Resolution: **"A RESOLUTION DECLARING A VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, DISTRICT NINE (9), CLEBURNE COUNTY, STATE OF ARKANSAS"**

JP Evans made a motion to adopt the Resolution. Roll Call was taken. Ayes: Blackburn, Caldwell, Cupit, Evans, Foust, Henegar, Malone, Owens, Pearson, Roberts. Nays: None. **Passed and adopted as Resolution 2020-008.**

Quitman Mayor, Cyndi Kerr, addressed the Court concerning ambulance service in the Quitman area and throughout the County. A very lengthy discussion was held with questions and comments from the public. Judge Holmes advised he could possibly appoint a committee to address this issue and/or a possible special election to collect ambulance service fees.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2020-CLEBURNE COUNTY COURTHOUSE ELECTRICAL UPGRADES GRANT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF CLEBURNE, STATE OF ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2019-020, WHICH ADOPTED THE BUDGET FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2020 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Cleburne County was awarded an extension on the \$96,676.89 left over on a grant awarded in 2019 to do electrical upgrades to prepare for new HVAC System(s) for the Cleburne County Courthouse. The Arkansas Historic Preservation Program approved September 10, 2020 the County's proposal of using the funding for repairs to the exterior of the Courthouse. The need exists to appropriate additional funding to pay for services to complete exterior improvements for the Cleburne County Courthouse. Since said Grant extension was given after the budget process, the amount of funding must be appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF CLEBURNE COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2020-AMBULANCE SERVICE SELECTION PROCESS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF CLEBURNE, STATE OF ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: “AN ORDINANCE FOR THE SOLICITATION OF STRUCTURED PROPOSALS FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE, ASSESSMENT OF STRUCTURED AMBULANCE SERVICE PROPOSALS AND PUBLIC HEARING AND SELECTION OF AMBULANCE SERVICE PROPOSAL AND AUTHORIZATION TO OFFER A COUNTY WIDE FRANCHISE FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE”.

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court recognizes the importance and need to adhere to the State of Arkansas statutory language and regulations, assure a competitive process between private businesses, and assure the best ground ambulance transportation service for the wellbeing of Cleburne County Residents and in an effort to abide by A.C.A. 14-14-802(b)(1);

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court, desires to advertise a solicitation for proposals that is well defined, and conclusive in what is expected from proposals; in an effort to abide by A.C.A. 14-14-802 and 14-266-102;

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court, desires to assess the proposal based solely on the merits of the proposal;

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court, desires to authorize the issuance of a ground ambulance transportation service franchise in accordance with A.C.A. 14-266-107; this Court directs the following:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF CLEBURNE COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

Section 1: AMBULANCE SERVICE SOLICITATIONS FOR PROPOSALS AND DEFINITIONS FOR PRINT

An invitation and solicitation to present a proposal in a specified format, for ambulance service for Cleburne County, shall be advertised twice, 7 days apart, in the paper of popular, general and local circulation. Advertising to start immediately upon passage of this ordinance and for the next available issue for which print deadline can be met. The content shall read as follows:

“The proposal shall consist only of content specifically and within the parameters of the specifications retained herein and be submitted in person, three (3) copies in sealed envelopes of the applicant’s response to the request for proposal, to the Cleburne County Clerk no later than twelve noon on January 31, 2021. The Cleburne County Clerk shall then immediately unseal and disseminate the proposals to the Justices of the Peace in the manner normally utilized for dissemination of pre-meeting information.”

A. Proposal Specifications: To any and all interested and qualified parties.

1. The Cleburne County Quorum Court is requesting proposals be submitted from licensed ground ambulance transportation services doing business in the State of Arkansas, that will provide a modern, highly qualified, experienced and responsible emergency medical services entity which provides certified, licensed emergency medical services personnel, and fully functional emergency and nonemergency ground ambulance transportations for operation in Cleburne County, Arkansas.
2. Therefore, pursuant to the declaration of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas found in A.C.A. 14-266-102, which provides that a qualified emergency medical/EMS and ground ambulance transportation service may be regulated at the local level, Cleburne County will now offer an exclusive EMS franchise to a qualified ground ambulance transportation service provider that submits a successful proposal based upon the specifications herein.

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3. Either party, for cause, may terminate this agreement with ninety (90) days' written notice to the other party.
4. The franchise will be granted based on rates and terms the Cleburne County Quorum Court determines and the franchise holder will charge the rates set by the Quorum Court. When determining the rates to be charged, the Court will not only consider the rates, but the quality of the service to be provided, the quantity and quality of the equipment that is provided, the level of service given, the quality and number of EMTs/paramedics and any other personnel to be provided, the staffing to be provided, and the effective personnel practices. Said rates are to be reviewed and approved annually by the Court. The Court will discuss and determine possible subsidy requirements based upon the successful bid.
5. The service area includes all of Cleburne County, less incorporated cities that are currently covered by a city issued franchise to a licensed ground ambulance transportation service that provides ALS (Advanced Life Support). Mutual Aid Service Agreements should be completed between the successful ground ambulance transportation provider and the current city franchise ground ambulance transportation providers.
6. Volunteer BLS (Basic Life Support) services in the county shall be allowed to continue operating within their individual service areas. Mutual Aid Service Agreements should be completed between the successful ground ambulance transportation provider and the volunteer BLS ground transportation service provider.
7. No franchise shall be granted to any provider who does not provide certified and licensed (by the Arkansas Health Dept.) paramedic services as part of or all of its ground ambulance transportation service.
8. The franchise will not be rewarded to any person(s) who is not an actual owner or operator and who is not fully responsible for the operations of the ground ambulance transportation service company.
9. The successful ground ambulance transportation service provider shall locate the ambulance operations in Cleburne County, including its main business office and ambulance headquarters.
10. Those parties interested in the award of an exclusive franchise to provide the emergency medical services and ambulance services to the area specified above must prepare a written proposal that contains a statement of full compliance with all Arkansas law, regulations, and specifications enclosed herewith. No applicant will be accepted unless the applicant is licensed by the State of Arkansas and an ALS service provider. No variances will be allowed.

B. Definitions:

1. **Ambulance**: means any ground motor vehicle that is constructed or equipped for and intended to be used for ground transportation of a person because of a medical reason including but not limited to an injury, illness, disability, or other medical related reason.
2. **Ambulance business**: means any Arkansas State licensed, for profit or nonprofit business entity, or business engaged in the business of transportation of persons for medical reasons.

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3. **Ambulance Operator:** means any person who, as owner, agent or otherwise, furnishes or operates, advertises, or otherwise professes to be engaged in the business of furnishing or operating ground ambulance transportation services in providing the ancillary and necessary emergency medical services or ground ambulance transportation service.
4. **Operation:** means the receiving, picking up, or embarking from within the service area of a sick or injured person, or for other reason indicating the need to obtain emergency or non-emergency medical treatment, any person for transportation to any other point wherever located including any healthcare facility.
5. **Person:** means the individuals either male or female, partnerships, firms, corporations (whether non-profit or for-profit) and associations of every kind and their agents, servants, or employees.
6. **Service area:** means all of Cleburne County, excluding cities who are currently covered by another licensed ALS ground ambulance transportation service franchise, excluding volunteer BLS ground ambulance transportation service, and that meets all Arkansas Health Department regulations regarding service area requirements. Other ground ambulance transportation franchises and volunteer ground ambulance transportation franchises may choose to sign Mutual Aid Service Agreements with the successful ground ambulance transportation bidder.

C. The content of the proposal shall include:

1. Provide the trade name, if any, under which business will be conducted; or, if a corporation, please provide a copy of Articles of Incorporation, certificate of good standing issued by the Arkansas Secretary of State, address of the principal place of business, list of principal officers; or, if a partnership, association or unincorporated company, the names of the partners or the persons comprising such association or company, and the businesses of each partner or person. NOTE: No elected officials or employees of Cleburne County or of any city within said county may be an employee of or a member of the board of the ground ambulance transportation services provider.
2. Provide the State of Arkansas ground ambulance license number and copy of the license.
3. List experience in the number of years your company has operated as a ground ambulance service provider.
4. List six (6) references to whom you have provided ground ambulance transportation service and who are willing to appear at the Quorum Court meeting for authentication and testimony, in as much as they are willing, and it does not violate HIPA.
5. Include a statement of financial stability from a federally insured financial institution.
6. Provide a copy of recent company credit report.
7. List, if as an applying company, the company, or any staff members, who as agents of the company, are currently or in the past 12 months been a party to any lawsuit for medical malpractice or any action as employee of the said entity.

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8. List all Directors or Owners of the applying entity that have ever been part of any other medical franchise, operation, entity or otherwise had interest in any medical business that has resulted in a bankruptcy filing and if so the current status of that bankruptcy.
9. Provide any documentation concerning complaints filed with the Arkansas Dept. of Health based on the ground ambulance transportation services provided by your business.
10. Include a statement of acknowledgment that if awarded the franchise the ambulance business will maintain all certifications mandated by Arkansas law and notify the Cleburne County Quorum Court in the event any certification should no longer be valid.
11. List memberships in medical and or ambulance associations and any efforts sought to get the ambulance service accredited.
12. List locations in which the ambulance business intends to maintain a base and procedures that will be exercised in the event all on duty-based ambulances are on calls and unavailable for response to a call. If backfill agreements are included then attach a copy of the agreement and make a statement of willingness to recognize and operate under emergency.
13. Provide a list detailing the number of dedicated EMTs and Paramedics operating under your license and their collective years of experience and licensures.
14. Provide a list of certified ALS and BLS ambulances available and owned by the licensed entity, including a description of each ambulance used or proposed to be used providing the name of the manufacturer, engine and serial numbers, VIN number, and critical incident management communications equipment that is capable, licensed, and operational on the Arkansas Wireless Information Network. Certify that each ambulance is adequate and safe for the purpose for which it is to be used and equipped as required by the Arkansas Health Department. Provide the odometer milage for each unit that will be operational. Any unit that reach 180,000 service miles can only be utilized as a backup.
15. Provide a copy of all operational policies, procedures, maintenance records, non-protected communication records and or other non-protected data related to historical and future ground ambulance transportation service activity.
16. Provide a statement certifying and verifying unit response time in the Cleburne County. Stated response time will be the standard for Cleburne County Ambulance Service.
17. Provide proof of liability insurance and willingness to name Cleburne County and participating cities within the county as additional insured for liability of \$1,000,000.00 per incident and \$2,000,000.00 per aggregate claim.

Section 2: ASSESSMENT AND SELECTION OF STRUCTURED AMBULANCE PROPOSALS

- A. Based upon the number of proposal responses, a method of weighing the proposal responses submitted from the ground ambulance transportation service providers shall be as follows:
 1. For each completed proposal item listed under a) Proposal Specifications, ten (10) points will be assessed;

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2. Two (2) companies with the highest number of accumulated points will be allowed to present their proposals to the Cleburne County Quorum Court to be held in a public place large enough to accommodate the public and all interested parties; and,

3. Should only two companies submit a proposal response, then they will be determined the finalist.

Section 3: FINAL PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Cleburne County Quorum Court will conduct a public meeting one (1) week after the selection process in Section 2: Assessment and Selection of Structured Ambulance Proposals above for the purpose of allowing the ground ambulance transportation service finalists to present their respective proposals to provide a county-wide EMS ambulance service and for the purpose of allowing a period of public input and comments.

- A. The public will be notified in any local publication of the date, time, and place of the public meeting;
- B. All those interested in providing public comments will be afforded three (3) minutes; and,
- C. The Quorum Court will vote on the best ground ambulance transportation service provider per the presentations and input from the public.

Section 4: AUTHORIZATION TO OFFER A COUNTY WIDE FRANCHISE FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE

- A. An ordinance, presented by the Ambulance Committee, will establish an ambulance franchise service for Cleburne County for a term of five (5) years effective March 1, 2021 and for as long as the ambulance service provides adequate, fair, and reliable service per the Arkansas Health Dept. regulations, ambulance industry equipment standards, and good faith service to Cleburne County residents and businesses.
- B. The Cleburne County Judge, upon completion of the requirements of this ordinance, shall offer a five (5) year franchise to the selected ambulance service as prepared by the County Attorney.

Section 5: All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
