CLEBURNE COUNTY QUORUM COURT JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

June 9, 2022

The Cleburne County Quorum Court met in regular session in the Cleburne Court Building, 922 South 9th Street, Heber Springs, Arkansas. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. County Judge Karl Martin presided.

PRESENT: Hall, Henegar, Caldwell, Blackburn, Malone, Evans, Martin, Foust, Roberts, Holmes. ABSENT: Tamburo.

READING, CORRECTION, AND DISPOSITION OF MINUTES:

Motion was made by JP Caldwell to approve the minutes of the May 12, 2022, regular meeting, seconded by JP Roberts. Voice vote, motion carried.

REPORT OF TREASURER:

Motion was made by JP Malone to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by JP Martin. Voice vote, motion carried.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

Ambulance: County Attorney Drew Smith gave an update on the proposed ordinance regarding the Survival Flight Ambulance service.

Jail: JP Evans announced a Jail Committee meeting is scheduled for Friday, June 10, 2022, at 9 a.m. in the Judge's Conference Room.

Ayes: Blackburn, Caldwell, Evans, Foust, Hall, Henegar, Holmes, Malone, Martin, Roberts. Nays: None. JP Evans read the Ordinance by title only. JP Evans made a motion to adopt the Ordinance, seconded by JP Martin. JP Evans reported that the 911 dispatch salaries did come before the Budget Committee and the committee has determined this is a way to resolve the amount of turnover occurring with 911 dispatchers. Roll Call was taken. Ayes: Blackburn, Caldwell, Evans, Foust, Hall, Henegar, Holmes, Malone, Martin, Roberts. Nays: None. JP Evans made a motion to adopt the Emergency Clause, seconded by JP Caldwell. Roll Call was taken. Ayes: Blackburn, Caldwell, Evans, Foust, Hall, Henegar, Holmes, Malone, Martin, Roberts. Nays: None. **Passed and adopted as Ordinance 2022-020.**

Proposed Ordinance No. 2022-Amend 2022-911 Budget

JP Evans introduced an Ordinance: **BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF CLEBURNE, STATE OF ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2021-035 WHICH ADOPTED THE BUDGET FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2022 TO AMEND THE EMERGENCY 911 BUDGET".**

Judge Martin addressed the court asking in which direction he needs to proceed regarding an accident that occurred when a poll worker was returning election material to the courthouse. After brief discussion, JP Henegar recommended the Court establish a precedent regarding matters such as this by possibly reimbursing for a deductible up to \$500 or \$1,000. Judge Martin agreed with JP Evans' request to bring this matter up in a Budget Committee meeting for discussion. County Attorney Drew Smith advised he would prepare a proposed ordinance.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION NO. 2022-WASTE CONNECTION FEE SCHEDULE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A NEW FEE SCHEDULE WITH WASTE CONNECTIONS TRANSFER STATION

WHEREAS, Cleburne County wishes authorize a new fee schedule with Waste Connections Transfer Station.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Quorum Court of Cleburne County, Arkansas, as follows:

Section 1. The new scale system at the Waste Connections Transfer Station is now operational. Resolution 2019-009 states that upon completion of the scales, customers will be charged a minimum of \$35 per ton and \$75 per ton for more than 1,000 lbs of trash. The Cleburne County Quorum wishes to change that to the customer paying the percentage of \$75 a 1,000 lb of trash. This will enable the county to keep and maintain adequate records in order to comply with APC & EC Rule 11.206(A)(1). The cost for trash bags and shingles shall remain the same. If the weighing system becomes inoperable or malfunctioning, then it is approved that Waste Connections shall be allowed to continue to take waste pursuant to the fee schedule under Cleburne County Resolution 2014-002.

Section 2. the Cleburne County Quorum Court hereby approves the following waste disposal fee structure:

- \$1.28 per less than thirty-three (33) gallon trash bag up to ten (10) bags;
- \$2.04 per thirty-three (33) gallon trash bag up to ten (10) bags;
- \$3.57 per contractor trash bag up to ten (10) bags;
- Percentage of a ton(s) at \$75 per 1,000 lbs;
- \$90.00 per ton for shingles

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Quorum Court of Cleburne County, Arkansas, approves the new fee structure as described in this resolution.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF CLEBURNE COUNTY, STATE OF ARKANSAS: AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: “AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE PURCHASE OF SERVICE EQUIPMENT FOR VOLUNTEER EMS SERVICE”.

WHEREAS, The Cleburne County Quorum Court finds it necessary to help offset some of the equipment expenses that the volunteer EMS services often pay for when updating and modernizing equipment; and,

WHEREAS, The Cleburne County Quorum Court has previously indicated that it would be receptive to hearing request for the volunteer EMS service equipment purchases; and,

WHEREAS, the time has come to appropriate money for said volunteer EMS equipment purchases.

Section 1. The Quorum Court hereby approves the appropriation of funds to the Wilburn Volunteer EMS Service for purchase of a Zoll Autopulse CPR Device in the amount of Eight Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten Dollars and Twenty-Four Cents (\$8,910.24).

**PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2022-ELECTION COMMISSION AND POLL WORKER VEHICLE
ACCIDENT REIMBURSEMENT POLICY**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF CLEBURNE, STATE OF ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RATE OF REIMBURSEMENT FOR CLEBURNE COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSIONERS AND POLL WORKERS WHO SUSTAIN DAMAGES TO THEIR PERSONAL VEHICLE WHILE TRANSPORTING PHYSICAL VOTING DATA AND/OR VOTING EQUIPMENT."

WHEREAS, The Cleburne County Quorum Court finds it necessary to establish the rate of allowable reimbursement to Cleburne County Election Commissioners and Poll Workers for damages to their personal vehicles sustained while transporting physical voting data and/or voting equipment.

Section 1. The Cleburne County Election Commissioners and Poll Workers shall be eligible to receive as reimbursement for vehicle damage the amount of his/her insurance deductible up to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to cover damages or accidents sustained while delivering or transporting physical voting data and/or voting equipment. Cleburne County Election Commissioners and Poll Workers must show a receipt or proof that their deductible has paid to be eligible for reimbursement under this Ordinance.

Section 2. No Cleburne County Election Commissioner or Poll Worker shall receive more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per accident for reimbursement for vehicle damage.

Section 3. Any amount of reimbursement paid under this Ordinance shall be reported by the County Judge to the Quorum Court at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Quorum Court.

Section 4. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed as a waiver of the County's tort liability immunity granted under Arkansas law, nor does anything in this Ordinance subject the County to any such liability on behalf of the Election Commissioner or Poll Worker or to any such third party.

Section 5. The County herein specifically reserves the right to deny payment under this Ordinance if the County should deem denial of reimbursement proper under the factual circumstances of each case.

Section 6. In the event that any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications to this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 7. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

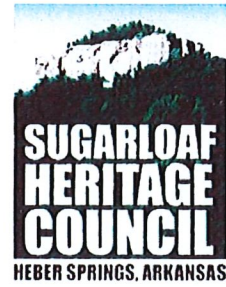
